- Focus Area 2 Resilience & Climate Adaptation: This session, led by Estonia, Bouygues Bâtiment International and the Conference of INGOs, will outline specific activities that the Alliance can take to help mitigate the risks of extreme weather and natural disasters, advance more resilient communities, and adapt to climate change in communities as part of the advancement of high-quality Baukultur.

 Focus Area 3 – Sustainability & Circularity: This session, led by Holcim, the European Council of Spatial Planners and UN-Habitat will outline specific activities that the Alliance can take to incentivize and accelerate adoption of sustainable and circular construction models, retrofitting of buildings and improved special planning to advance net zero and naturepositive communities.
